Thursday 10th October 2013 saw the third Annual Baradine Central School Horse Sports Competition take place in conjunction with St Lawrence's Primary School making it a two day event held at Baradine Showground. 121 students from Kindergarten to Year 12 ventured from 37 schools across the Western Region and as far afield as Bathurst in the South and Bourke in the West to take part in our competition. The program of events opened with the judging of Best Presented School. The overall presentation of the rider and horse combinations was of an outstanding standard, making judging very difficult. Congratulations to Mudgee High School who took out the trophy and also to St Johns School Baradine and Sacred Heart Coolah who were runners up.

Riders commenced competition with the Age Hack, followed by Boy and Girl Riding Events and Pair of Riders. First place winners of the riding events also rode in the Champion Boy and Girl Riders with the judges being Lisa Moody, Mandy Lamey, Lucy Grant and Fiona Pennell. Congratulations to Charlotte Bennetts of Coolah Central School and Hamish Chappel of Burren Junction Public School on winning Champion Girl and Boy Riders under 11 Years, and to Adelle Beer of Mudgee High School and Harry Jackson of Dubbo College Delroy Campus on winning Champion Girl and Boy Riders over 11 Years.

The afternoon's sporting events consisted of the Flag, Bend, Barrel and 3 Mug Races, Keyhole, Time Trial and Bonfield Bounce. Students participated to the best of their abilities and demonstrated excellent sportsmanship and respect towards event volunteers and their peers. The Team Barrel ran as the conclusion of the sporting events and was a real crowd pleaser.

The end of day presentation saw the Todd Family Perpetual Trophy for Most Successful School (judged on point average across all nominated riders) awarded by Dennis Todd to Mudgee High School. 
