





Term 3 - Week 8 - 2nd September 2013

A program to help children process their experience of natural disaster.

Representatives from schools and support agencies across the district came together for 'Stormbirds', a full day workshop held at the Josephite Hall in Coonabarabran on Wednesday 14th August. It was facilitated by Jeanette Foxe, a Sister of St Joseph with a background in education, now involved with the Good Grief Programs and instrumental in creating the 'Stormbirds' program.

The program is designed to help children and young people process their experience of natural disaster. It has already proven beneficial to students affected by fires in Victoria, flooding in Queensland and New Zealand's earthquake in Christchurch. Stormbirds will now be used to help young people who have been directly OR indirectly affected by the January fires in Coonabarabran and district.

This is a small group program of four sessions that aims to support children;

Manage the personal impact of the changes they have experienced

Understand that their reactions are normal

To "take charge" of their attitudes, feelings and behaviours

Develop skills for coping, problem solving and decision making

Build their support network with families, friends, teachers and others

You will receive more details about the program in the near future. If you think your son or daughter would benefit from participating in this small group (4-8 students) program we would encourage you to talk to him/her about it.


