




Signing Your Child Out Of School

The Year 11 students are exploring financial mathematics learning about loans, credit cards, managing fees and charges, and learning how to manage credit. We are off to a great start in the first term of their HSC year. Here are some of the issues we are addressing in class:

Avoid multiple balances – Having only one credit card is easier to manage than trying to manage several. Multiple credit cards can also mean you may over-extend yourself and find it hard to repay what you have borrowed.

Choose wisely – Before signing up for a card, make sure you select one that best suits your situation. Look at the annual percentage rate, annual charges, late payment fees, and cash advance charges.

 Pennywise and pound foolish – If you can't afford it, probably a good idea not to purchase it. For too many consumers, sticking a charge on the credit card doesn't seem as painful as paying with cash at the time.

- Review your cards –It doesn't hurt to occasionally shop around for the best deal or deals out there. If you're not happy with your present card provider, call them to see about getting a better APR for starters.
- Protect your cards Last but not least, identity theft continues to be a major issue in the credit card world. Protect your PIN, don't let the card out of your sight when making a purchase.


