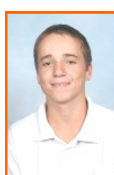

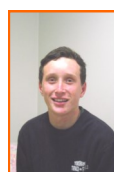

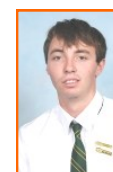

Bendigo Australasian Dorset Show

On Thursday the 8th of September, Billy, Holly, Brody, Madison and Mrs Wright travelled to Bendigo to compete at the Australasian Dorset Championships.

We joined with St Lawrence's Primary School and travelled to Bendigo in convoy. It was a long 10 hour drive and we arrived in Bendigo at 7.30pm. We put hay into the stalls, set up water and feed for the sheep and helped other studs with their sheep.

On Friday morning we fed and watered the sheep and took them for a lead. Then we spent the day carding the sheep, while Mrs Wright and Mrs McGoldrick did some more clipping. That afternoon we went into Bendigo for a look around. Before dinner time we sprayed the sheep so that they had a tan look to them.

On Saturday we led the sheep in their judging classes.

We got some great results and these included:

Madison's ewe was placed 1st in her class and also received Reserve champion ewe. Her ewe was also awarded the Best Dorset horn head.

Billy was awarded a 1st with his woolly ram.

Brody's Poll Dorset Ewe was awarded a highly commended and 5th place in the pair of ewes.

Holly's ram was awarded a 6th place and her Dorset Horn ewe was awarded a 1st place.

In the progeny groups Madison and Holly's Dorset Horns were awarded a 1st place and Billy's group received 3rd place.

In the group class Brody's group was awarded a 1st place and Madison and Billy's sheep a 3rd place.

On Saturday night we went to the circus. It was an enjoyable show with some great tricks.

On Sunday we competed in the Handlers Competition. The handler's competition is judged on how well a person can lead and present their animal plus be aware of the judge.

In the 12 years and under handler's class Madison was awarded 5th place and Holly was awarded 6th place.

In the 13 years and under 18 years' handlers Billy was awarded 3rd place and Brody 4th place.

On Monday we watched the Poll Dorset ram sale and once this was finished we loaded the sheep and headed to Finley for the night. We unloaded the sheep into a shed at the Finley showground and stayed in cabins at the caravan park.

On Tuesday morning we loaded the sheep and drove home. Between West Wyalong and Forbes, we went through 5 lots of flood water over the road.

We had a great time and learnt many new skills. We played lots of handball and even had Stud owners joining in on the game, as they walked past.

Our students did a fantastic job and are to be commended on their hard work and excellent representation of our school. Well done.
