PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Remembrance Day

A delegation of student and staff representatives attended the Remembrance Day service at the cenotaph last Friday to pay our respects to the contributions of the veterans who served to protect our nation. Wreaths were laid by our School Captains who did an excellent job. Unfortunately, the whole school was unable to attend this year due to conflicting commitments on the calendar.

Assessment and Reporting

It's that time of the year when all teachers are busily assessing and collating their student data and work samples from over the year to determine the progress of each individual in their class. Secondary students have their yearly examinations this week while Primary students are undertaking annual benchmarking in elements of literacy and numeracy.

The process for teachers completing student reports takes several weeks and I envisage them being available to parents/caregivers on Presentation Night.

Tell Them From Me Survey - student feedback

<u>Primary: Students in Years 4-6</u> completed the survey a few weeks ago. Some of the feedback includes:

- <u>Students with positive behaviour at school</u> –
 In this school, 86% of students had positive behaviour. The NSW Gov. norm for these years is 83%.
- <u>Students who are interested and motivated</u>
 80% of students in this school were

interested and motivated. The NSW Gov. norm for these years is 78%.

<u>Secondary: Students in Years 7-10</u> completed the survey. Some of the feedback includes:

- <u>Student participation in school sports</u> 79% of students in this school had a high rate of participation in sports. The NSW Gov. norm for these years is 56%
- <u>Intellectual engagement</u> 46% of students in this school are intellectually engaged.
 The NSW Gov. norm is 46%.
- <u>Effort</u> 72% of students in this school tried hard to succeed. The NSW Gov. norm for these years is 66%.

Head Teacher Process

The process is underway for the selection of a new Head Teacher (Teaching and Learning) to join current Head Teacher (Secondary Studies) Mr Edwards. Interviews will be conducted next Monday and an announcement should be made on the position by the end of the month, following the mandatory ten day appeal phase.


The second HT position is dependent on the school holding its current secondary enrolment numbers (60+).


YEAR 5/6

The Pillowcase Project

October 2016

During Hurricane Katrina, students of a local university used pillowcases to carry their cherished and basic possessions while evacuating campus. Upon hearing this, Red Cross staff developed the concept of using a pillowcase as an emergency kit.

The program quickly grew into a disaster resilience education program, that has since become known as the Pillowcase Project.

The Pillowcase Project is a disaster resilience education program designed to help build student knowledge and capacity in disaster preparedness.

Aimed at students in Years 3 and 4, the 60 minute lesson includes a discussion about the importance of being prepared and interactive activities to help students prepare their mind for an emergency and consider what to pack in an emergency kit.

Each student is then given a pillowcase to decorate and take home, to start their own personal emergency kit.


