We learnt how to be a better leader and that the little things matter, we also learnt to be a person of focus. It's not always easy but it's worth it and to be the best you can be.

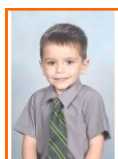

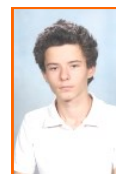
