Queen's Baton Relay 2018

Our school is celebrating the selection of three of our own for the Queen's Baton Relay leading up to the Commonwealth Games at the Gold Coast 2018.

Congratulations to staff member Richie Milgate and two Year 8 students Madison Masman and Billy Carey. They will join approximately 3,800 other baton bearers.

Their selection is a huge credit to each as they were subject to a rigorous nomination process involving addressing criteria including:

- have achieved something extraordinary or inspired others to achieve something extraordinary;
- have made a significant contribution within the community; and
- have excelled or aspired to have excelled athletically or personally.

Starting in Australia on 25 December 2017, the Queen's baton relay will travel for 100 days visiting communities across all states and territories, showcasing Australia's history, culture, traditions, geography and people to the world.

The Queen's Baton relay will share the excitement of the Games with millions of people around the world, shining a light on the Gold Coast, Queensland Australia and the world-class sporting action to come.

The Commonwealth Games are 4 April -15 April 2018. They coincide with the last two weeks of school's Term 1 next year.

Upper Hunter Scone Beef Bonanza

On Thursday the 26th Of October 2017, Mrs Wright, Mrs McCutcheon, Mrs Wendy Woodham, Nariah Cunningham, Mariah Pennell, Ashanti Pennell, Holly Woodham, Madison Masman, Bradley Worrell, Molly Murray, Savannah Carey, Billy Carey and Suzannah Carey travelled to Scone to compete at the Upper Hunter Beef Bonanza. On Friday morning Suzannah Carey led the Primary Waverly Station steer in her paraders and his steer judging class. Suzannah did a fantastic job and received a highly commended for the steer and her parading. Savannah Carey led the secondary Waverly steer in his class and was placed 6th. Nariah Cunningham led Wave in the Parader's class and did an excellent job but was unlucky in receiving a place. Saturday morning saw the judging of our steers. Simba was led by Mariah and was awarded a 4th place in his class and Dip Stick led by Nariah was awarded a Highly Commended in his class. Another great result. Our Big Red steer injured his hoof on the truck, so was unable to compete and has been brought home to repair. On Saturday afternoon the Primary, 12/13 years and 14-year Parader's competed in the parading competition. Suzannah Carey was awarded a 4th place in the Primary section, Molly Murray a 4th place in her 12/13 year heat and Ashanti Pennell 2nd place in her heat. This is a fantastic result, as there are over 800 students competing at the Upper Hunter Beef Bonanza. On Sunday morning our students were involved in the judging competition and in the afternoon the 15 and 16-year-old students competed in their parading competition. Nariah Cunningham was awarded a 3rd place in her 16 years heat. All students had a fantastic time, and all did their best in the classes they competed in. They represented our school with pride and looked very smart in their Agriculture uniforms. Celebrate Attendance

Hints and Tips No. 4: Good Attendance



There are a number of sound reasons for you to ensure that your child attends school regularly.

Firstly, attending school every day makes learning easier. For younger students, missing the basic skills often leads to learning problems later on and for older student's absenteeism often interferes with academic progress. Friendships with other students are also easier if your child attends school regularly.

The law in NSW states that all children between the ages of 6 and 15 years are required to attend school. Sickness or injury, attendance at a special religious ceremony or a serious family situation are satisfactory reasons for non-attendance. Please let the school know why your child is not at school and provide an explanation on your child's return to school.

Birthdays, haircuts, pension days, Mondays etc are not satisfactory reasons for absence from school. Also try whenever possible to arrange your holidays in school vacation times.

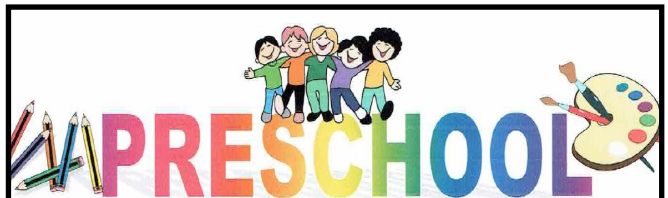
