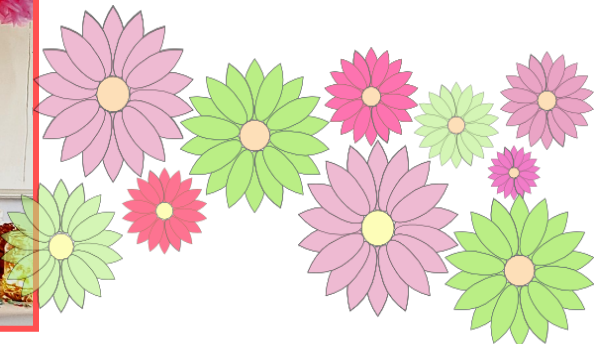

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Parent Teacher Evening

Attendance Concerns

As we draw closer to the end of the school year, it is important that your children continue to attend daily and not enter into early holiday mode.

The school attendance monitoring is clearly indicating increasing absenteeism particularly in secondary.

The Home School Liaison Officer will be contacting parents of students with chronic absenteeism during her visit on Thursday. Support mechanisms will be offered to these parents to improve each student who has fallen below 85% attendance this term.

Sickness, excursions and exemptions are not counted in the monitoring calculations.

- Be enthusiastic but don't scream or shout instructions from the sideline
- Emphasise trying hard not winning
- Cheer & acknowledge good plays by all players, both teams
- Accept decisions by officials (they are human & can make mistakes)
- Let coaches do the coaching
- Always remember volunteers run kids sport
- Understand and support your club's code of conduct
- Allow your child to play for themselves (it also makes the experience on and off the field)
- Think before you speak (your words may harm others)
