NAPLAN

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 completed the annual NAPLAN tests for writing, language conventions, reading and numeracy this week. The results will be released towards the end of Term 3 when parents will receive a report on their child's performance. These reports clearly show how the student performed compared to other students in their grade across Australia and also compared to their own cohort at Baradine Central.

Federal budget

Following the release of the Federal Government's budget last week, the Minister for Education, Hon Simon Birmingham, has written to all schools advising them of their increased funding for next year. Baradine Central School will receive an additional \$28,600 in 2018.
