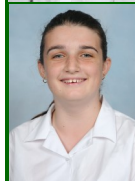

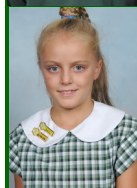

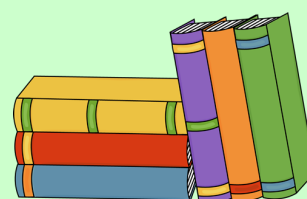

## HSC Trial Preparation Lectures Stream Live for Regional NSW Students

### Information to Year 12 students & parents

For the last eleven years, HSC in the Holidays, in partnership with UTS, Macquarie University, UON and UOW have been conducting live events on campus for HSC students during holiday periods.
