HSC Trial Preparation Lectures Stream Live for Regional NSW Students

Information to Year 12 students & parents

For the last eleven years, HSC in the Holidays, in partnership with UTS, Macquarie University, UON and UOW have been conducting live events on campus for HSC students during holiday periods. The program includes lectures across 18 different subjects.

For the first time, we would like to extend an offer for students at your school to gain access to these lectures during the July holidays via our **live streaming service**. Year 12 students can view a high definition video that is broadcast live during these lectures. This will include all presentation material and access to detailed lecture notes.

Each lecture is designed specifically to increase student knowledge and skills prior to the HSC Trial Exams in Term 3. Specifically, Each two hour session will be presented by a highly experienced HSC Teacher/Marker and will address the following areas:

- Key content from the core topics, particularly focussing on the most difficult components of the syllabus where errors are made.
- Examination tips and strategies to maximising marks;
- Insights into what HSC markers are looking for within responses;
- How to respond to a range of HSC questions and be provided with worked answers/solutions.
