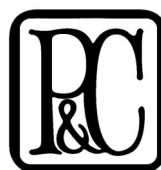
This year's school photos have arrived and the new company, Montage, has done a superb job resulting in high quality photos of the classes and individuals.

# Year 1/2/3

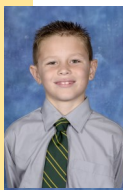

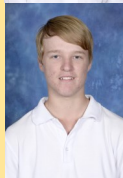

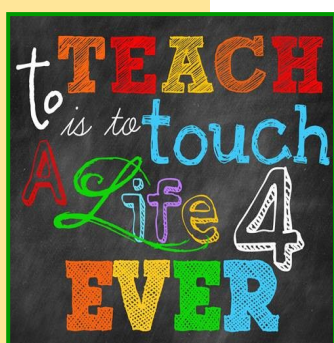
