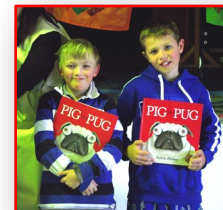
I ask that you please be patient with school processes during this period as the office will often be understaffed.

## NAPLAN Online

NAPLAN is moving online. This means moving NAPLAN from the current paper-based tests to computer-based assessments. The transition to NAPLAN online will commence from 2018.

NAPLAN Online will provide better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information. Assessments will use an adaptive 'tailored test design', which gives students questions better suited to their achievement level. This form of testing will help teachers customise their teaching more specifically to student needs.

Later this term students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 will to be involved in a sample school readiness test. This readiness test is about testing the schools ability to manage our technology capabilities. It is not about testing student abilities. Parents will not receive a report back. More information will be sent home with Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students shortly.
