Primary Homework

<p>Kinder/Year 1 Miss Lummis</p>	<p>Homework for this week will consist of a maths sheet and weekly spelling words. I have also included the weekly news topic where your child will have the opportunity to share this with the class on their assigned news day. Please be reminded that 10 minutes of daily reading is encouraged. Welcome back to Term 3!</p>
<p>Year 2/3/4 Miss Dorman</p>	<p>Homework will be handed out at the beginning of each week. Each student will receive a homework matrix and a math worksheet each week. Homework is to be completed at home each night and monitored by parents. Students who hand in their homework eight weeks this term will receive a reward to encourage them to complete their homework regularly. Homework Centre will run each Wednesday from 3.30 to 4.30pm.</p> <p>Homework will consist of the following tasks:</p> <p>Home Reading – At least 15 minutes reading each night Students should complete 15 minutes reading each night. Students will be given a home reader to take home each week. This reader will be replaced when the previous book has been returned. I will provide a reading log to keep track of student home reading.</p> <p>Spelling Students need to learn their spelling words for the week. They can write, sing, rap or say their words, whatever is going to work best for them. You might like to give your child a verbal spelling test each night after they have had a go learning their words themselves. An in-class spelling test will be done weekly to check progress.</p> <p>Maths Students will receive a weekly math worksheet that focuses on the skills learnt in class that week.</p>
<p>Year 5/6 Miss Baldock</p>	<p>Homework is given out every Monday and is due every Friday. It comprises of a choice matrix, spelling, multiplication practise, home reading and a speaking and listening project. Don't forget Homework Centre is on every Wednesday! It is a great place to complete all weekly homework tasks. Remember to bring in a piece of fruit or veg for our daily 'crunch and sip'. Don't forget to keep sending in your empty soft drink bottles and cans to school for the 'Return and Earn' program. This is one of our major fundraisers for this years excursion to Canberra.</p>

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data School Students with Disability

Information notice

Background

All Education Ministers from Commonwealth, state and territory governments endorsed the implementation of a Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) in all Australian schools (government, independent and Catholic).

The nationally consistent approach to data collection provides all Australian schools, education authorities and the community with a clear picture of the number of students receiving adjustments because of disability in schools, and the adjustments they are provided to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students.

Authority for the national data collection

The Australian Education Regulation 2013 requires the operators of all government and Non-government schools that receive Australian Government funding (approved authorities) to provide information to the Australian Government Department of Education and Training (The Department) for the purposes of the national data collection.

The information in relation to each student with a disability at a school operated by the approved authority includes:

- the student's year of schooling
- the student's category of disability (physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional)
- the student's level of adjustment (support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive adjustment).

The information **will not explicitly identify individual students** (subsection 58A(3) of the Regulation); no information that could reasonably enable the Department to identify individual students will be provided by approved authorities to the Department.

Information from the national data collection will also be used for policy development undertaken by the Department, including informing funding considerations relating to students with disability, and other policy development as agreed by the Education Council.

Can I make use of this service if I'm not eligible?

Of course! Smiles Onsite can do almost everything that your local dentist can do on board their state-of-the-art mobile Clinic. If you would like them to see your child for a scale and clean, fillings, fissure seals etc., these services can be offered with NO GAP payable at a price of \$99.

This service is a great opportunity to get kids into the habit of good oral hygiene, and we hope you're as excited about it as we are!

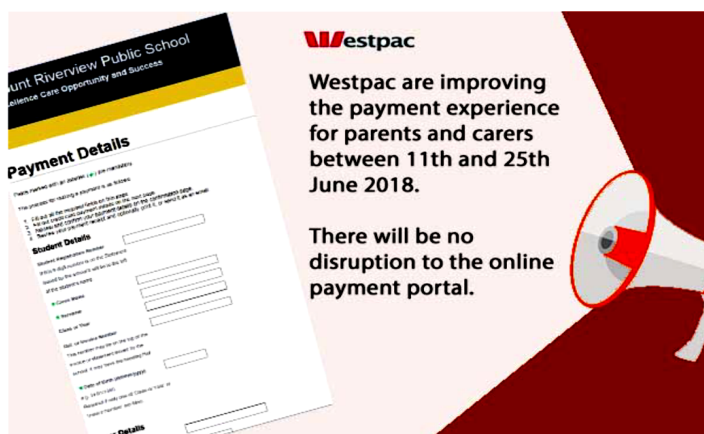

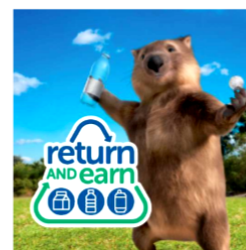

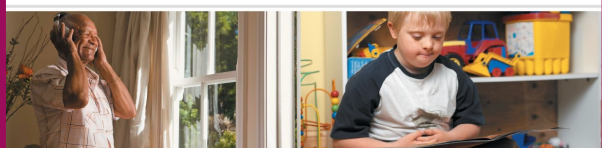

Purple, Black and White

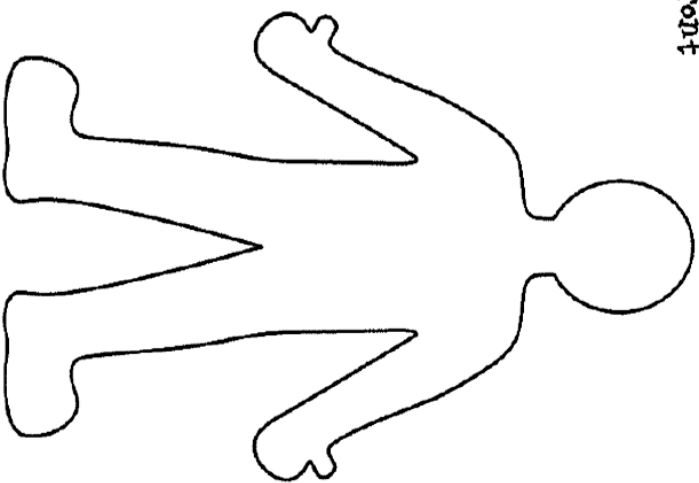
(Children may omit one colour and send through entries that are perhaps just purple and black

OR

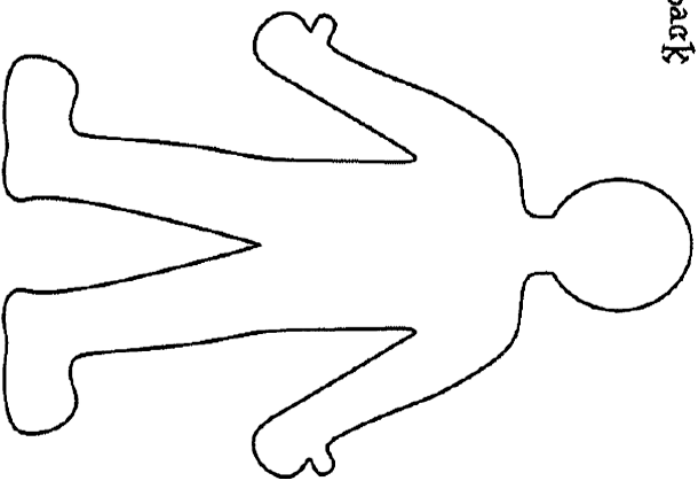
Pink, Aqua and White
