Dear Parents and Caregivers

Reflecting on Semester One

There will be **NO** Staff Development Day on Monday July 22nd.

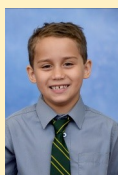
Our Staff Development Day will be on Friday 2nd August.
