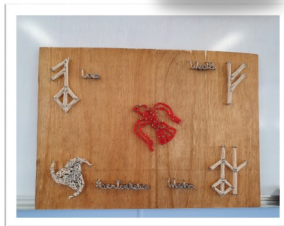


# School News

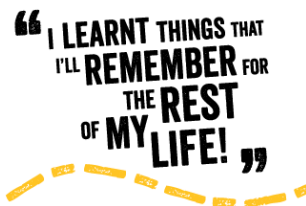
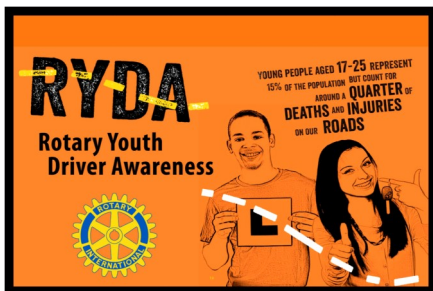
## Year 11 Rotary Youth Driver Awareness– RYDA
