

#### Uniform

Students in NSW government schools are required to wear a school uniform.

At BCS, our uniform is predominately bottle green with some gold and black.

Pink, red, blue, purple etc does not belong at BCS. This includes:

Various coloured North West jumpers

ASPIRE red jumpers

Magpie jumpers

The Senior School SRC had it's hoodie design endorsed by P&C and the office will be doing a bulk order. Until the new hoodies arrive, students without green jumpers can inquire about the clothing pool at the office.

Students who genuinely have no uniform on any particular day must have a note from parents or be prone to detentions.

PRIMARY: All primary students wear a school hat, which may be purchased through the school. The colour is green.

Girls: Winter - Green and white check pinafore or long black tailored pants (not tracksuit), long sleeved white shirt, black leather shoes with black socks or black stockings and green school sloppy joe/jumper.

**Boys:** Winter - Grey trousers with grey shirt and green sloppy joe. Black leather shoes with grey socks.

SECONDARY: For safety reasons practical subjects such as Agriculture, Food Technology, Technics, Visual Arts, Design And Technology and Science require leather shoes with

**solid soles and closed in uppers**. Students without suitable footwear will not be allowed to participate in these practical activities.

**Girls: 7-10** -Winter - A heavyweight checked skirt or long black tailored pants (not tracksuit), white shirt, black leather shoes, white socks or black stockings, green sloppy joe jumper.

**Boys: 7-10** -Winter - Grey trousers, white shirt, black leather shoes with grey socks and green sloppy joe/jumper.

#### **YEAR 11 AND 12**

**Girls:** Winter - Senior skirt, white shirt, black leather shoes, white socks or black stockings, green sloppy joe/jumper.

**Boys:** Winter - Grey trousers, white shirt, black leather shoes with grey socks and green sloppy joe/jumper

#### **SPORTS UNIFORM - UNISEX**

<u>Primary</u> - Black shorts with BCS logo or plain black track pants, with green/gold polo shirt with emblem, green sloppy joe/jumper, sports shoes and white socks.

<u>Secondary</u> - Black shorts with BCS logo or plain black track pants, with green/gold polo shirt with emblem, green sloppy joe/jumper, sports shoes and white socks










## Primary Class News


