

#### MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

## Dear Parents and Caregivers

This is the beginning of another interesting week in our world of the Coronavirus pandemic. I will release as much information about the impact of COVID-19 on BCS's operations as often as possible via our available communication resources:

I am aware that there has been talk in the community, of people who went on the Canada excursion, having the virus and spreading it. I want to assure you and the wider community that no one from the school has tested positive to the virus and as the Canada travellers returned on February 24, some four weeks ago, they are all in the clear and well past any incubation period.

Our school's approach has been to provide our students with some awareness of the pandemic situation but maintain normal routines as much as possible.

Over recent weeks, quite a few students and staff have had sickness (cold & flu symptoms) and anyone who presents at schools as unwell, will continue to be sent home for the duration of the sickness.

Lam appreciative of how inundated our local doctor's surgery has been and will continue to be. So for the time being, a phone call to the school explaining absence due to sickness, will suffice instead of the usual required doctor's certificate.

These meetings will be conducted outdoors to allow for the 4 square metre social distancing regulation and will occur at a time that is mutually convenient.
