

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MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents & Caregivers,

Term 3

Welcome back to Term 3. Unexpectedly, a legacy of COVID-19 period of learning from home last term, has been the school's attendance rates remaining very low. This is causing major concern, as those students effected, will likely not meet their curriculum requirements. All students are required to be at school daily unless they are sick and have a medical certificate.

The school is continuing to operate under the required health and safety COVID-19 protocols. These include intensive additional daily cleaning of 'high touch surfaces', adults practising social distancing, students routinely washing and sanitising hands, drinking from water bottles (not bubblers), unwell people staying away from the school and unnecessary visitors to the school restricted access. Parents and carers should not enter the school grounds unless they ring first and present at the office to complete necessary paperwork.

The canteen has reverted to normal operation with Fiona Edwards managing this service.

Education Week - Learning Together

Next week, public schools will be celebrating the annual Education Week. This year's theme is 'Learning Together'.

We will be recognising those parents and carers who's efforts were noticed, when supporting their children through the learning at home period. An array of Semester One student work is being put on display for the community to view in the old bakery window in Wellington St. Some photos and film will be shared with the community on the website and also the Facebook page. Primary will share and celebrate achievements from learning together during COVI-19 at their Friday awards ceremony. Secondary will be finalising the sporting teams' competition during sport on Wednesday.

Unfortunately, formal assemblies and parental participation at school events are still on the COVID-19 restrictions list.

Counselling Service

Our school has a counsellor (trained psychologist) onsite most Fridays. Her name is Teresa Nguyen. Teresa is available for counselling students on a wide range of needs, either referred by teachers or parents/carers, once a permission form is signed by the parent/carer.

Uniform

The second order of green and gold hoodies arrived last week and orders were distributed. The uniform is now looking very smart with students proudly wearing the school's colours in quite a choice of winter warmers.

Town Bus (Murray's bus)

The town bus service is not a free for all. The Ministry of transport stipulates it is limited to:

- Years K-2—no minimum distance
- Years 3-6 who reside more than 1.6km straight line or at least 2.3 km walking from the school.
- Years 7-12 who live more than 2km straight line distance or more than 2.9km walking.

Some students have been reminded they cannot be on the bus so should be walking or riding a bike to school.

Bus Zone

I am currently negotiating with Warrumbungle Shire Council on two matters: an appropriate relocation of our bus zone; and the creation of a delivery bay entrance off Queen St, for industrial arts and hospitality workshops. Unfortunately, the bus zone was moved to an inappropriate location before the holidays and now students are required to trek along the grass verge towards Hollywood.

However, following recent consultation with council personnel, I am hopeful in coming weeks, of it being moved back to be adjacent to our Queen St pedestrian entrance and the concrete pathways.
