Anti-bullying

The school's anti-bullying team meets routinely to monitor and address reports of any face to face and/or online bullying encountered by students K-12. Students are encouraged to speak up as either a victim or a bystander. They can leave an anonymous notification in the Bully Box or tell any member of staff or the student leadership team.

Bus Behaviour

All students are expected to behave appropriately and safely on buses to and from school. Bus drivers report disorderly conduct to parents directly. When warranted, breaches of Dept Transport passenger code of conduct, can result in the

passenger being removed from the bus service.

Parents are responsible for their children's supervision & behaviour at bus stops in the morning when going to school and in the afternoon when arriving home.

Schools are responsible for their students' behaviour at their bus zone drop off and pick up sites at the school.

Schools have no obligation to provide supervision on government bus services.



The girls swam well and put in a huge effort and narrowly missed out on selection for State.


