#### Staff Development Day

Staff returned last Monday from the holiday break for a professional learning day. The focus of the training was collaboration to enhance our delivery of curriculum.

#### **Check in Assessment**

Students in Years 4, 6 and 8 have been completing online assessment for literacy and numeracy. The results of these tests generate data for the school that assists with future planning of teaching and learning to meet student needs.

#### NAPLAN

The national assessment (NAPLAN) is scheduled for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in mid May (11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>). These tests encompass elements of reading, writing, spelling, grammar & punctuation and numeracy.

Parents will receive a very informative report in September on your child's results showing how they performed and how they ranked against the school's average and also the national average.

#### **Health Checks**

The school hall will be a hive of activity next week when a team of medical professionals arrive to screen all students K-12 for dental, hearing, sight and general wellbeing. The screening is conducted in a sensitive manner and the outcomes remain confidential information shared between the medical practitioners and the parents/ carers.




