In Week 7 we had trainers from the Regional Industry Experience Partnerships come in to run a Trade Skills Program. We had over 20 students participate in this program over four days. certificate at the completion of the course. More events will be scheduled in the future with a focus on mining jobs and a look at aeromechanics.


